

POLYSTYRENE

(Styrofoam is a Dow brand name)

Food/Beverage Containers

Reduce: Avoid purchasing food that comes in polystyrene containers. If you are a hard core; bring your own reusable containers for take-out food.

Avoid purchasing polystyrene cups, plates and bowls. Use table settings made to be washed and reused or designed to be composted.

Reuse: Reuse the containers by storing leftovers, snacks or lunch foods in them. Use the containers for art projects or for holding small items like paperclips or screws.

Packing Peanuts

Reduce: Avoid using polystyrene. Package things in popcorn, crumpled paper or crunched up plastic shopping bags. Ask shipper to use starch or paper-based peanuts that can be reused and or composted.
